The Linking Policy & Implementation for Gender Equality project in Namibia



Introduction ING

The Linking Policy and Implementation for Gender Equality in Malawi, Namibia, and Zimbabwe was a three-year programme that began in October 2021 and was conclude in September 2024. This three-year project has ultimately contributed to an increase in gender equality and a reduction in GBV in Southern Africa. When social and gender norms are disrupted and civil society organisations and movements have the capacity to advocate for better policies and laws, then governments and communities are better in addressing GBV risk factors and thereby preventing/ reducing GBV incidents.

Gender-based violence is a major problem in Southern Africa, one that disproportionately affects women. GBV has a significant negative economic and social impact on the region, with 50% of women in the region at risk of experiencing GBV. GBV is a human rights violation that comes with devastating consequences for individuals, families, communities, and societies.

What has been done to combat or prevent GBV

the project worked to change attitudes, and questioned gender roles and stereotypes
that made gender-based violence acceptable in the Namibian society. This was done
through organising campaigns, workshops and trainings in various regions such as
Khomas, Kunene and Zambezi regions.

respective communities..

Capacitating MenEngage Namibia Members organizations

The MenCare initiative engaged men in effective ways which reduced gender inequalities and to promoted the health and well-being of women and girls, including putting an end to all forms of gender based violence. As fathers, men benefited by developing closer and more emotionally connected relationships with their children and stronger bonds with fellow fathers over their shared experiences of fatherhood.





A GLOBAL FATHERHOOD CAMPAIGN



Lifeline/Childline Namibia in collaboration SONKE through the Linking Policy & Implementation for Gender Equality project funded by ADA (Australian Developent Agency) conducted a Men-Care training with Men Engage Namibia network members. This training took place at Lifeline/Childline Namibia training hall from the 10th to 11th of June 2024.

This training took a comprehensive look at MenCare's ultimate goal which promoted men's involvement as equitable, nonviolent fathers and caregivers in order to achieve family well-being, gender equality, and better health for mothers, fathers, and children. MenCare worked at multiple levels and engaged individuals, comunities, institutions, and policymakers.

MenCare Workshops

Lifeline / Childline Namibia in collaboration the City of Windhoek (Municipality) through the Youth Development and Training Office successfully conducted a Men-Care training with 15 male participants that were randomly selected from the Katutura community. This training successfully took place at the Katutura Community Hall from the 10th to 20th of November 2023.













LifeLine/ChildLine Namibia in partnership with the office of the Hardap regional Governor successfully conducted the Hardap regional Men's conference in November 2023, which focused on recognizing, valuing and acknowledging men as agents of change toward social contributions in the fight for gender-based violence. And to support men in understanding and question existing gender social norms, by creating awareness on the impact of GBV and the role men can play in addressing GBV and incorporating the MenCare elements.
